

## MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX®: New regulations in 2021

At the start of the year, the OEKO-TEX® Association as usual updates the applicable test criteria, limit values and requirements for its range of certifications and labels. For MADE IN GREEN by OEKO-TEX® the following new regulations come into effect immediately:

### New regulations for MADE IN GREEN article components

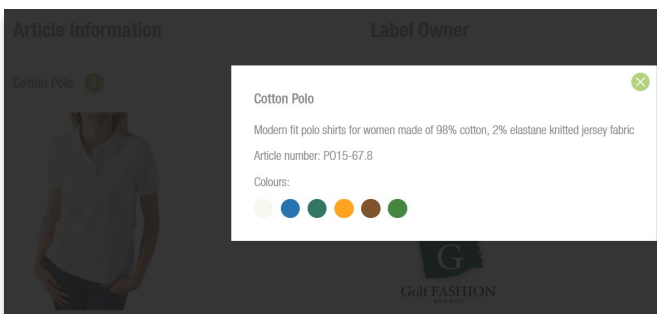
In order to ensure MADE IN GREEN supply chain transparency for buyers and consumers, production facilities should add at least three components for finished products or one component for semi-finished products.

### Requirements for article name and description

The article name of a MADE IN GREEN label should consist of the product name and the type of product (e.g. product brand name). The article description should consist of the material composition and any other important product description (e.g. fibre contents, dyeing, finishing and / or printing processes).

### MADE IN GREEN Label Check on oeko-tex.com

The MADE IN GREEN Label Check is constantly developed further with the goal to foster transparency. All colours in which the article is offered will now be displayed on the Label Check. When clicking on the icon of a vertical facility, the pop-up will show all types of operation (production processes).



**New implementation examples of the MADE IN GREEN criteria with regard to STeP certifications in MADE IN GREEN standard, annex 4 (as of 01.04.21):**

The new implementation examples will facilitate the understanding of which processes / production facilities must be STeP certified in order to obtain a MADE IN GREEN label. The release date for this update is April 1st, 2021.
